RESOLUTION

BY: WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE (8/14/12)
 WHEREAS, The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) provides federal funds through the EMPG Program for state and local emergency management programs; and
 WHEREAS, As the designated grantee of the EMPG funding in Michigan, the Michigan State Police Emergency Management and Homeland Security Division (EM-HSD) enters into agreements with local emergency management programs each year; and
 WHEREAS, Reimbursement for the emergency management program is contingent upon completion of the activities in the signed Emergency Management Work Plan, which is maintained in the Emergency Management Coordinator's office; and
 WHEREAS, In order to remain eligible for EMPG funding, current and adequate plans must be maintained and exercise requirements met. In addition each program must complete their quarterly work agreement activities and submit all necessary quarterly documentation to MSP-EMHSD; and
 WHEREAS, This EMPG Agreement is for the current fiscal year and the agreement covers 37.027545% (\$25,369.00) of covered program expenses; Therefore, Be It
 RESOLVED That the Bay County Board of Commissioners approves the Agreement for the Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) for FY 2012 and authorizes the Chairman of the Board to execute said Agreement on behalf of Bay County following legal review/approval; Be It Further
 RESOLVED That grant application/recipient departments are required to work with the Finance Department whose staff will provide financial oversight of said grant; Be It Finally
 RESOLVED That related budget adjustments, if required, are approved.

RESOLUTION

BY: HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE (8/21/12)

WHEREAS, The Senior Citizens Millage has supported the Division on Aging's senior programs since 1975 at .50 mills, and has been generously supported by Bay County residents for renewal on a number of occasions; and

WHEREAS, The Senior Citizens Millage generates the largest share of the Bay County's Division on Aging's budget and over the past ten years, Bay County has experienced a 42.4% increase in the population of individuals aged 55 to 64 years and a 32.1% increase in those aged 85 years and older; and

WHEREAS, The Division on Aging has experienced an increase in requests for services as the senior population has grown and DOA has made every attempt to meet the demand and avoid placing individuals on waiting lists for services, particularly home-delivered meals; and

WHEREAS, For many years the food service facility located at Riverside Center was able to meet the need for senior meals (home delivered and congregate), however, due to the current growing demand for meal services, (predominately home delivered) as well as the anticipated growth of the aging population seeking meal services, the kitchen is near capacity due to its physical size, as well as equipment that is old and inefficient and in many cases unable to be repaired; and

WHEREAS, The current .50 mill is not meeting the financial cost to provide services to a growing senior population nor is there enough revenue generated to make improvements to the Riverside Center food service facility; and

WHEREAS, A proposed .3 mills increase, placed on the November 2012 ballot separate from the existing .50 mills which is up for renewal in 2015, is essential to make kitchen improvements, as well as prevent any interruption of senior services; Therefore, Be It

RESOLVED That, subject to approval, the following ballot question be submitted to the electors of this County on November 6, 2012, for the purpose of levying .3 of a mill for a period of 5 years, 2012 - 2016 inclusive, for senior citizens' programs and related facilities:

SENIOR CITIZEN MILLAGE PROPOSAL

"Shall the limitation on the amount of property taxes which may be levied each year against all taxable real and personal property in the County of Bay be increased by not more than .3 of a mill (30¢ per \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of 5 years, 2012 - 2016 inclusive, for senior citizens' programs and related facilities? This new millage will raise estimated revenues of \$580,000 in the first year of the levy".
