Study of Home Hygiene Gathers New Followers

SALT LAKE CITY, Utah, March — (UP)—Rapid changes in economic life have brought clear realization of what home hygiene means to the family, Dr. L. J. Nuttall, Jr., superintendent of Salt Lake City public schools, told the American Red Cross convention here.

"Since the recent changes in economic conditions, adults are realizing more and more that their education should not stop with graduation from school," Dr. Nuttall said.

Honore Pays Tribute To County On Structure

The buildings, public and private, of any community are a declaration of the nature of the people of that community, disclosing intelligence, respectability, and enterprise, if the people have these qualities, or convicting them of ignorance, if they have not.

How many times have you heard judgment of a community, expressed by tourists passing through it, on the evidence reflected in its buildings.

In the new Bay county building, Joseph C. Goddeyne has designed a monument to the progress of the community—a monument that proclaims forcefully, the intellectual emancipation and advancement of the present generation.

Give His Measure

Compare the slavish repetition of non-essentials, in the sheep-like conformity of the buildings of the past, with Mr. Goddeyne's efficient elimination of all that is not useful, either as a physical or social asset, and you have a fair picture of what has happened to the thinking processes of the community.

Fine as his achievement is, it could only have happened in a community that was ready for it, and one that recognized that the elimination of frills was not merely for economy but toward the end of sturdiness and beauty. Beauty is not an adornment to be put on, or left off, but a sense of order integrated in the very foundations and structure of a building.

That is why we engage men of vision and creative ability to present our cherished institutions to the world, instead of housing them in factory-like structures.

Influence On Community

That is why any work of art is not so much a thing, as an ever widening influence in the world, for the advancement of mankind.

If the people of Bay county do not know it already, they will realize in four or five years that the community has been enriched by the addition of this building—economically and spiritually, economically in that it will blaze the trail for further development, spiritually in that it will stimulate the consciousness of thousands to appreciation, self-improvement and the courage to believe in the potentialities of the community.

NAZI RUM INCOME BASED ON LOW TAX

Germany Finds High Levy Cuts Consumption

BERLIN, March — (UP)—The United States should not maintain too high a whisky tax if she expects a good revenue return and hopes to cut out bootlegging, in the opinion of German spirits manufacturers.

German experience has been that after the tax reaches a cer-

tain level, apparent consumption shrinks and smuggling and bootlegging increase.

Despite the vigilance of the protective association, which cooperates with federal and state police, bootlegging, moonshining and label faking still persist in Germany.

STOCKHOLM, March — (UP)—The remains of a ship from the Middle Ages have been found embedded in earth near Lake Mem, in Central Sweden. Originally, the ship measured about 46 feet in length, and experts say it may easily be restored.

Old Lake, Near Marsh Reveals Tragedies of Water

HORICON, Wis., March — (UP)—Horicon Marsh, at one time the site of the largest artificial lake in the country upon which steam-

ers navigated daily, has yielded up a number of old relics.

In the exact center of the marsh, now a game preserve, bits of wreckage have been found which were identified with ships scheduled to arrive in port 50 years ago. In one spot part of a large boiler surrounded by blocks of quarried stone indicate the conclusion of one voyage.

Two other vessels are known to have gone down in the lake. One, a scow, sank in July, 1857, when lightning struck it during a hurricane killing three of the crew and seriously injuring the remaining 13. The other disaster occurred two years later when the boiler of the steamer, *Winee*, exploded killing two.


