

HOW DO WE START?

Call and provide information about the person with dementia. Then make an appointment for an Initial Visit to tour the center, meet other participants and the staff, and participate in activities. Then schedule a Trial Visit. Following these visits the staff will determine if the program can meet the needs of the person. Additional Trial Visits may be required before a determination is made.

THE ENROLLMENT

The older adult must be formally accepted and enrolled to attend the program on a regular basis. The Enrollment Assessment includes obtaining information on the older adult's social and medical history, current functional status (abilities and limitations), medications, and emergency care arrangements.

PROGRAM FEES

Fees for service are charged by the hour and include breakfast, lunch, snacks, and activities. Limited financial assistance may be available based on income.

PROGRAM SUPPORT

The day program is supported in part by funding from Region VII Area Agency on Aging, United Way of Bay County, A&D Home Health Care, Bay Arenac Behavioral Health, fees for service, contributions, and in-kind support (lunch) from Bay County Division on Aging. The dementia training classes are funded by Title III-E funds from Region VII Area Agency on Aging and the Alzheimer's Fund of the Bay Area Community Foundation.

Located in the Bay County Child & Senior Citizen Center, Golden Horizons is the senior component of the inter-generational day care agency. As a private, non-profit, 501 (c)(3) organization, donations are tax deductible.
