

**Fall Flu Shot Clinics**

It is that time of year to immunize against the dreaded flu. Bay County Division on Aging, in cooperation with the Bay County Health Department want you to stay healthy and are making special opportunities available to receive your shot.



Influenza (the flu) is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses. It can cause mild to severe symptoms and could lead to death. Some people, such as young children and older adults, especially those with certain health conditions, are at high risk for complications from the flu. CDC recommends that everyone 6 months of age and older receive a flu vaccine. Flu peaks between October and March. The flu vaccine provides protection that will last throughout the entire Flu Season. For your convenience the following clinics have been set up for our Bay County residents.



Those with severe allergies to chicken eggs, with an allergic reaction to flu vaccines in the past, or who have had Guillain-Barre Syndrome (GBS), should speak with their doctor about other ways to prevent getting the flu.

What to bring: Those who have Medicare Part B, bring their red/white/blue Medicare Insurance Card for billing. Driver's license or Michigan ID. Please check with your health insurance to confirm they cover the flu vaccine. For those without medical health insurance coverage, the fee will be \$25.00.

Bay County's 2012 Audit was presented on September 10, 2013, to the Bay County Board of Commissioners by the independent auditing firm Rehmann Robson of Saginaw. Bay County received an unqualified opinion on the financial statements which means they were presented fairly, in all material respects, in conformity with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. Therefore, Bay County was able to add \$995,428 to the General Fund's fund balance for the year ended December 31, 2012, which will aid in funding many projects benefiting Bay County citizens postemployment benefit (OPEB) obligations.

The auditors noted that decreases in taxable values are beginning to stabilize in 2013 while substantial increases in health care costs are expected through 2019. A balanced budget was adopted in 2013.



### DNR Shoreline Access Study


Bay County is partnering with MDNR on a Shoreline Access Study. This public engagement project is to explore options for active recreational development at the shoreline and management along the beach at the Bay City Recreation Area (BCSRA).



The purpose of this effort is to be able to increase access to the Saginaw Bay - be it physical access, shoreline fishing access, or even a visual access point. The more access available to people to get to the Saginaw Bay, the greater the draw to the region for numerous activities.

A stakeholder's meeting is scheduled for October 21, 2013 from 4-6:30 at the DoubleTree Hotel to get public input on the types of recreational waterfront activities the community would like to see along the waterfront, such as swimming, kite surfing, standup paddle boards, cafe/restaurant, pier, shops, etc.




Bay County has many responsibilities and services that it provides its residents. This could not be done without the hard work and skills of its employees.

Bay County is currently obtaining permits for Fall 2013 treatments of phragmites, along the northern Bay County coastal area to include Pinconning Park.

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service requested that we increase the area we are currently treating for phragmites management along the Saginaw Bay shoreline and provided us supplemental funds for this purpose

This grant is a result of the Saginaw Bay Coastal Initiative's work to reduce phragmites along the shoreline of our region.






