



# Michigan's Food & Agriculture Industry

Agriculture in Michigan contributes \$60.1 billion annually to the state's economy, making it the second-largest industry.

Production agriculture, food processing and related businesses employ about 1 million Michigan residents.

Michigan produces over 200 commodities on a commercial basis, making the state second only to California in agricultural diversity.

Michigan leads the nation in the production of 20 commodities (including tart cherries, blueberries, Niagara grapes, cucumbers for processing, 13 floriculture crops, and three varieties of dry beans) and ranks in the top 10 for 29 other commodities.

Michigan exports about one-third of its agricultural commodities each year.

Michigan has about 10.1 million acres of farmland, and the state is home to 53,000 farms averaging 191 acres each.

More than 35 percent of the state's total farmland is in some form of preservation agreement.
