RE: Annual Review of the Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund

Background:

Since October 2008 the Bay County Board of Commissioners has followed the Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund ("Fund") Policy that keeps a reserve of 20% in the Fund after the annual distribution to the tax units.

As of July 1, 2020 the Fund had \$1.1 million on hand. This is after the annual disbursement to the tax units of \$6.1 million and before the 2020 budgeted transfer of \$1,100,000. Transfers to the General Fund have been approximately the amount the fund has earned. The Fund has not had to borrow since 1998.

However, there has been litigation surrounding the General Property Tax Act and there has recently been a ruling in *Rafaeli v. Oakland County* that may result in a liability for the County. The litigation is not fully resolved and there is no way to know our potential liability given the multitude of decisions yet remaining.

Finance:

The amount of delinquent taxes turned over to the County from the local units has been fairly stable. However, the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic is still yet to be seen. It is anticipated that this could significantly increase the amount of delinquent taxes to be purchased next year and even the following year.

For the year ended December 31, 2019, the Fund net revenue before contribution and transfers was \$1,084,814. After adding net forfeiture/foreclosure revenue of \$1,926 the cash flow from operations was \$1,086,740.

Recommendation:

The Delinquent Tax Revolving Fund is functioning as intended and has allowed having an adequate amount on hand to make the annual distribution to the tax units without having to borrow.

However, given the potential liability in litigation and the COVID-19 pandemic impact I cannot recommend transferring any funds to the General Fund in 2021 so that adequate funds exist to continue making the distribution to the tax units.



Per County Ordinance No. 28, as amended August 9, 2016, which created a Budget Stabilization Fund – and states the fund will not exceed 20% of the County's most recent General Fund budget or 20% of the Average of the County's five most recent General Fund budgets, whichever is less.

BACKGROUND: Per the Bay County Ordinance No. 28, as amended August 9, 2016, Section 3.002 Appropriations to the Funds states "Each fiscal year the County Commission may appropriate by a resolution adopted by two-thirds of its members elected and serving, all or part of the surplus in the General Fund resulting from an excess of revenues in comparison to expenses, to the Budget Stabilization Arrangement."

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION: For the Fiscal Year Ending December 31, 2019, Bay County ended the year with a General Fund surplus of revenue over expenditures of \$806,303. The current balance in the budget stabilization arrangement is \$6,824,764.32 which is 18.67 percent of the \$36,559,063 General Fund 2019 originally adopted budget. Based on Ordinance No. 28, the lesser amount would be 20% of the five most recent GF budgets, which would calculate to \$7,143,780.64. Based on the calculation, I would recommend increasing the Budget Stabilization fund by \$319,016.32.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board authorizes the increase of the General Fund's committed fund balance for the Budget Stabilization arrangement by \$319,016.32, from the unassigned Fund Balance account. This would create a final balance of \$7,143,780.64, which would reflect the 20% average of the five most recent GF budgets.

LAST SEPTEMBER, THE BAY COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT SUBMITTED A GRANT PROPOSAL TO THE MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT, GREAT LAKES AND ENERGY (EGLE) AND THE CURRENT FETCH GIS MAPPING PROJECT HAD HELPED TO IDENTIFY SEPTIC SYSTEMS THAT ARE AT RISK FOR FAILING IN THE KAWKAWLIN RIVER WATERSHED DUE TO AGE, SOIL STRUCTURE OR INSUFFICIENT CURRENT DATE ON THE SYSTEM. COMM. RYDER:

COMM. RYDER COMMENTED THAT WITH THE 25% MATCH, THEY CAN COMPLETE SIXTY (60) SYSTEMS, HE ASKED WHAT IS THE PROCESS OR ENFORCEMENT FOR HOMEOWNERS TO CORRECT THE PROBLEM WHEN THE SYSTEM IS FOUND INEFFICIENT. JOEL KWIATKOWSKI, ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH MANAGER SHARED THAT 75% WILL COME FROM GRANT FUNDING AND THE OTHER 25% WILL COME FROM THE HOMEOWNER NO MATTER WHAT THEIR INCOME IS, TO REPLACE THE SEPTIC SYSTEM. THEY WILL BE HIRING A PART-TIME TEMPORARY SANITARIUM FROM THE GRANT AND THE REST WILL COME FROM IN KIND SERVICES FROM JOEL'S DEPARTMENT. THIS WILL BE A THREE (3) PROJECT AT \$180,000 PER YEAR TO SPEND ON SEPTIC SYSTEM REPLACEMENTS, THE NUMBER WILL DEPEND ON THE COST OF EACH SYSTEM. EVERY SYSTEM IS MAPPED DIGITALLY AND THEY CAN GO OUT AND CHECK FOR FAILURES AND EVERY ONE THAT FAILS QUALIFIES FOR THE PROGRAM, THEY MUST BE A MEMBER OF THE SAGINAW BAY WATERSHED, CONTRACTORS HAVE TO BE SET UP AS VENDORS FOR BAY COUNTY AND THEY MUST BE CERTIFIED AND LICENSED. COMM, RYDER CONFIRMED WITH JOEL THAT FOR THE FIRST THREE YEARS THIS IS A VOLUNTARY PROCESS, JOEL CONFIRMED YES IT IS.

EXECUTIVE JIM BARCIA:

EXECUTIVE JIM BARCIA, THANKED JOEL KWIATKOWSKI FOR HIS WORK PREPARING THE APPLICATION FOR THIS GRANT. HE WAS TOLD BY THE EGLE STAFF WITH OUR TRACKING SYSTEM WE HAVE IN PLACE, EVERY SEPTIC SYSTEM HAS BEEN PIN POINTED ON OUR COUNTY MAP. HOPEFULLY THIS WILL MAKE AN IMPROVEMENT TO OUR WATER QUALITY AND THIS IS A RELIEF FOR OUR RESIDENTS TO HAVE GRANT MONEY TO HELP DEFRAY THE EXPENSIVE COSTS OF REPLACING A SEPTIC SYSTEM AND PROTECTING OUR

ENVIRONMENT.
