The technical proposals were reviewed by VDA Elevator and Escalator Consultant, the County's contracted consultant, and based on this review all three (3) firms were then scheduled for a question-and-answer session to clarify some points of the bid and to gain a greater understanding of the firm's process. The sessions were conducted by VDA with committee members in attendance and able to ask questions and seek clarifications.

Upon completion of the meeting and review of the modernization and long-term maintenance pricing the committee accepted VDA's recommendation to award the bid to Otis Elevator.

Also, within the RFP maintenance cost was requested for the elevators located at the Law Enforcement Center, this request is reflected in the long-term maintenance pricing. This will now secure all five (5) elevators under one maintenance agreement.

This award was based upon pricing, equipment proposed, overall knowledge of the facility, and best value provided to the County.

Finance/Economics:

The base price for this project is \$978,000 which includes a complete turn-key project. The long-term maintenance pricing of \$1,300 per month is based on the lump sum monthly rate for five (5) elevators referenced within the RFP.
