ROAD MILLAGE PROPOSAL

Shall Garfield Township levy up to 1.0 mills (\$1.00 per \$1,000.00 of taxable value) above the tax limitation imposed under Article IX, Section 6, of the Michigan Constitution, and levy it for four (4) years, December 1, 2010 through December 1, 2013 inclusive, for the purpose of raising revenues for the maintenance and improvement of public roads in Garfield Township, raising an estimated \$40,300.00 in the first year the millage is levied?

MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL BUILDING AND SITE SINKING FUND TAX LEVY

Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation of 1 mill (\$1.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Freeland Community School District, Saginaw, Midland and Bay Counties, Michigan, be renewed for a period of 6 years, 2011 to 2016, inclusive, to continue to provide for a sinking fund for the construction or repair of school buildings and all other purposes authorized by law; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2011 is approximately \$343,120?

A PROPOSAL TO CONVENE A CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DRAFTING A GENERAL REVISION OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION

Shall a convention of elected delegates be convened in 2011 to draft a general revision of the State Constitution for presentation to the state's voters for their approval or rejection?

PROPOSAL 10-2

A PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE STATE CONSTITUTION TO PROHIBIT CERTAIN FELONS FROM HOLDING ELECTIVE OFFICE AND SPECIFIED TYPES OF PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT POSITIONS

The proposed constitutional amendment would:

Make a person ineligible for election or appointment to any state or local elective office or to hold a position in public employment in this state that is policy-making or has discretionary authority over public assets, if:

- within the preceding 20 years, the person was convicted of a felony involving dishonesty, deceit, fraud, or a breach of the public trust; and
- the conviction was related to the person's official capacity while holding any elective office or position of employment in local, state or federal government.

Require the State Legislature to enact laws to implement the prohibition.

Should this proposal be adopted?

LIBRARY SYSTEM MILLAGE RENEWAL

Shall the limitation on the amount of general ad valorem taxes which may be imposed each year for all purposes upon real and personal property within the County of Bay under Article IX, Section 6 of the Michigan Constitution be renewed for 1 mill (which is equal to \$1.00 per \$1,000 of taxable value) for the period of four (4) years, 2011 through 2014, inclusive, for the purpose of funding general operations, programs and services of the Bay County Library System? The amount of revenue the County will collect if that millage is approved and levied by the County in the first year is estimated to be \$2,958,553. The proposal is a renewal of the current millage.
